State Performance Plan:

The State Performance Plan (SPP), as authorized by the *Individuals with Disabilities Education Act* (IDEA) 2004, sets the context for focused monitoring. States are required under federal law to evaluate and report on efforts to implement the requirements and purposes of the IDEA. The plan includes evaluating and reporting on specific indicators.

SPP Indicator 4A – Suspensions and Expulsions

SPP Indicator 4A is the percent of districts that have a significant discrepancy in the rate of out-of-school suspensions and expulsions of greater than ten days in a school year for children with an individualized educational programs (IEP). (20 U.S.C. 1418(a)(1)(A) and § 300.600(d))

SPP Indicator 4B – Suspensions and Expulsions by Race or Ethnicity

SPP Indicator 4B is the percent of districts that have:

- (a) A significant discrepancy, by race or ethnicity, in the rate of suspensions and expulsions of greater than 10 days in a school year of children with an individualized education program (IEP).
- (b) Policies, procedures, or practices that contribute to the significant discrepancy and do not comply with requirements relating to the development and implementation of IEPs, the use of positive behavioral interventions and supports, and procedural safeguards.

(§ 300.600(d) and 20 U.S.C. 1412(a)(22))

In addition, pursuant to the IDEA, §§ 300.600 and 300.149(a)(1)(2), as part of State monitoring and enforcement, the Office of Special Education (OSE) must ensure that the requirements of the IDEA are carried out and that educational programs for children with disabilities meet the State's educational standards (including the requirements of this part).

Section 2: Selection Criteria:

For Indicator 4A, Michigan identifies districts with 2014-2015 data greater than the State threshold of five percent of students with an IEP suspended/expelled out of school for greater than ten days as having a significant discrepancy.

For Indicator 4B, Michigan identifies districts with 2014-2015 data greater than the State threshold of 3.6 percent in at least one racial/ethnic group of students with an IEP suspended/expelled out of school for greater than ten days as having a significant discrepancy.

The district must ensure that its policies, procedures, and practices are compliant for all students with an IEP including those who are {Race/Ethnicity}.

Section 3: Preliminary Summary:

The policies, procedures, and practices used by the district in the suspension and expulsion of {Race/Ethnicity} students with an IEPs were reviewed to determine whether they:

- Contributed to the significant discrepancy.
- Complied with requirements relating to the development and implementation of IEPs, the use of positive behavioral interventions and supports, and procedural safeguards.

Next Steps:

A focused monitoring report will be issued to the local on May 15, 2016. This report will provide written notification of any noncompliant policies, procedures, or practices requiring revision. All areas of noncompliance must be corrected as soon as possible but no later than one year from the date of notification. If this deadline is not met, this will impact the local's Determination and the State will take action to promptly bring the local into compliance; this may include increased state supervision and/or financial sanctions.

If findings of noncompliance are issued, the local must submit a focused monitoring corrective action plan by July 1, 2016 to address all areas of noncompliance. The OSE will assign staff to provide technical assistance to the local.
